Doctors of the world(MdM) aim to improve the health conditions of the homeless, the marginalized and others excluded from health care services, here and abroad. In the last year, MdM led a needs assessment in Victoria to identify the gaps in access to health care services for marginalized people. The Mobile Clinic of MdM is an innovative means of reaching out the homeless population, offer them care in the private, safe and respectful setting on the street, parks and other places on the margins of the city.

The objective remains to combine our efforts with those of community workers addressing homelessness enable individuals who need continuing medical and social care to reintegrate into the public health care system.
